Have fun! It's not homework so try to just enjoy yourself.

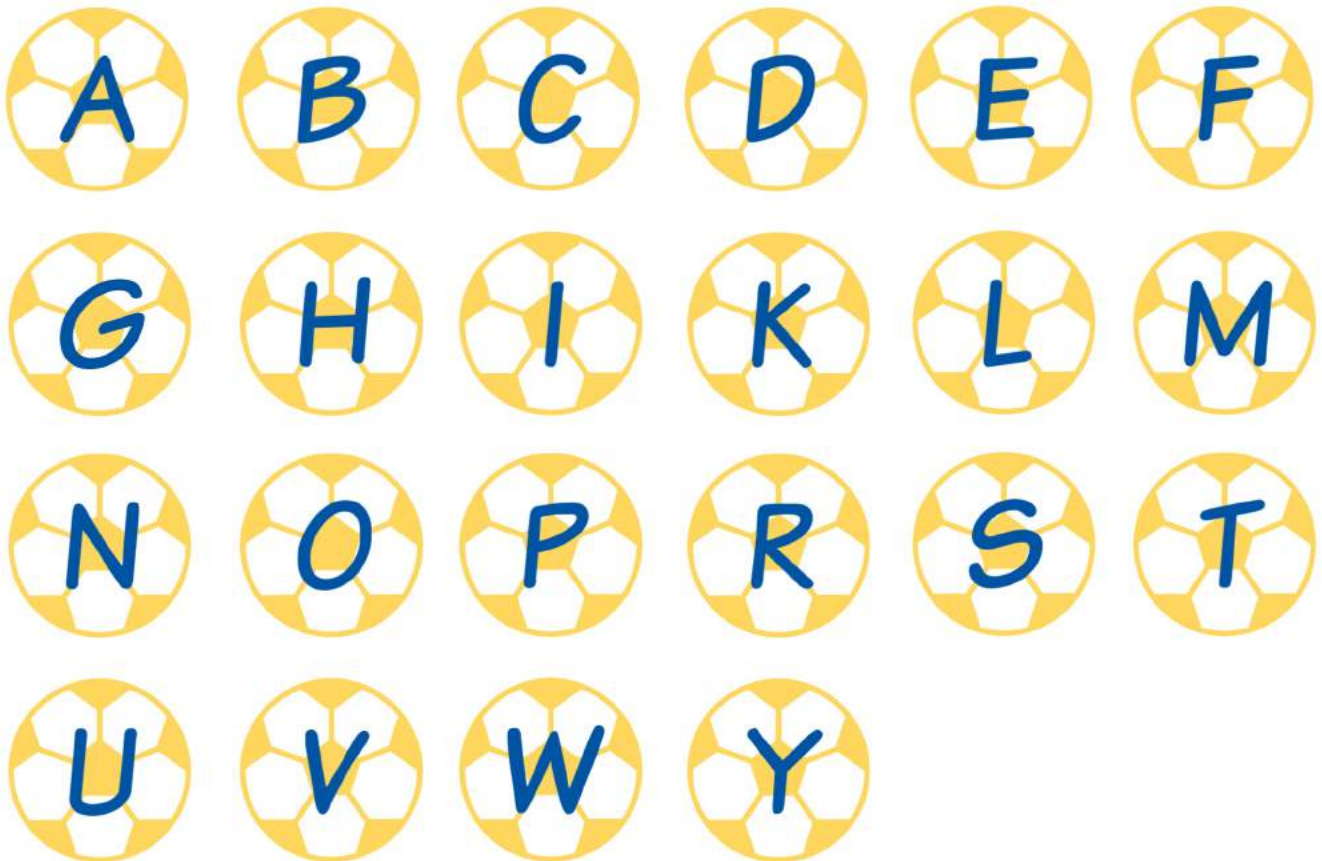
